• FATAL CRASHES: 7

Four crashes were single vehicle crashes; Three crashes were multiple vehicle crashes.

• FATALITIES: 7

One (14.3%) of the fatalities were alcohol-related.

Five (71.4%) of the people killed were vehicle occupants.

Three of the five (60%) were not wearing safety restraints. No child passengers requiring a child restraint device were killed. Two motorcyclists were killed; One was wearing a helmet. No pedestrians were killed.

• The number of fatalities for 2013 July 4<sup>th</sup> 102-hour holiday period was 19.

#### **HIGHEST DEATHS**

The highest number of deaths in a 102 – hour Fourth of July holiday period occurred in 1996, when 27 people were killed in traffic crashes in Tennessee, yielding a fatality rate of one death per three hours and 42 minutes.

#### LOWEST DEATHS

The lowest number of deaths in a 96 – hour Fourth of July holiday period occurred in 2011, when 8 people were killed in traffic crashes in Tennessee, yielding a fatality rate of one death every 12 hours.
